

# Don't Recycle

## PLASTICS

### Packaging

- Polystyrene (Styrofoam)
- Plastic or Styrofoam egg cartons
- Meat, cheese, deli, or cookie trays
- Plastic bags, wrap, packaging, or film ("cling wrap")
  - Bags recycled at some local supermarkets
- \*Packing peanuts or blocks

### Yard, Garden, and Garage

- Plastic swimming pools
- Lawn furniture
- Black plastic
  - \*Flower or plant pots
  - \*Containers used for motor oil or auto products

### Household

- Dishes or cups
- Toys
- Plastic coat hangers
- Decorative light holders
- Plastics from electronics or appliances
- Pails, buckets, clothes hampers, or recycling bins
- Medical supplies
  - \*CDs, video tapes, cassettes, or cases

## PLASTICS, cont.

### Other

- Caps, lids, or pumps
- Bottles over 2 gallons in size (such as kitty litter containers)
- Pill or vitamin bottles under 2 inches
- Empty containers that held chemicals, including: paint, poison, pesticides, solvents, or adhesives

## GLASS AND METALS

### Household

- Window or auto glass
- Dishes or glasses
- Ceramics
- Broken glass
- Wire hangers
  - Accepted by many area dry cleaners
- \*Paint or Aerosol Cans
- \*Light bulbs

## PAPER PRODUCTS

### Office

- Copy paper packaging

### Kitchen

- Soda or beer holders/cartons
- Pizza boxes
- Egg cartons (can be composted)
- Paper Plates/Cups
- Food-Contaminated Paper

### Household

- Waxed paper or waxed cardboard
- Wrapping paper
- Detergent boxes
- Photographs
