1. <u>Call to Order:</u> The meeting was called to order at 7:02 pm by Denise Hardie. Technical issues

3. School Committee Clarification of RAAC Vice-Chair

Carol Lombardo was nominated as vice-chair of the RAAC. School Committee accepted

nomination unanimously. There was some discussion of the role of Ms. Lombardo on the

Facilities subcommittee and the membership of that subcommittee. This discussion was tabled

4. Introduction and Orientation (DH)

Ms. Hardie reviewed the need for school committee and district goal setting and shared

samples of strategic plans (and excerpts of strategic plans) from three school districts. These

plans were briefly.

5. <u>SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats) Exercise</u> (TL)

Mr. Lee led the committee in a pre-goal setting discussion using the SWOT protocol. Members

identified the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats as follows:

Strengths:

SCHOOL: "Welcoming school, high staff satisfaction, strong staff, respect for students and staff,

students feel belonging, positive culture (admin), small school size, students are known, effective SEL

practices, good community involvement/PTA, well supported, beautiful rural campus, special needs

students well-supported, readiness to innovate"

SC: "Dedicated and ready to work, Optimistic, Wants each child to reach their full potential."

Weaknesses:

SCHOOL: "Transportation, (travel time), homogeneous population, little diversity, limited staff fo English

Learners, Curriculum cohesiveness, food (must ascribe to NSLP requirements), small school funding

challenges, finding staff (sometimes), safety and security, lack of before and after school options

(support of working families), location limits choice enrollment

SC: Knowledge, relatively few current parents on committee

Opportunities:

SCHOOL: More music, world language, more PD days for staff, vocational strategies, grant seeking,

writing, cultural partnerships, attract and recruit more choice participation, robust models of tiered

instruction, partner with other small schools

SC: MASC Training, Collaboration, Regional Agreement

Threats:

SCHOOL: Funding factors linked to declining enrollment and birthrates, staffing challenges, no

vocational or pre-vocational programs

SC: Succession, findinding individuals willing to serve

## 6. <u>Discussion and Proposal of Goals</u>

The Committee discussed results of the SWOT activity. The proposal of goals was tabled for a time when the full Committee could be present and after means were developed to seek the input from the community of the school district.
